

Welcome

As printed in the original November 12, 1950 bulletin

Welcome to all on this day of the first regular service in our new location. We are a group of God's people making history in trying to meet the needs of this large and growing metropolitan city. The latest government statistics indicate that Metropolitan Atlanta has had an increase of 221,417 in the last ten years. Incorporated Atlanta has increased only 24,674. That indicates a trend that is not only arresting, but commanding. The religious body that does not hasten to build rapidly and encourage new congregations to be formed will lose it's opportunity. Methodists don't propose to be short-sighted, and your presence is an indication of that purpose.

On last Sunday afternoon about eighty people gathered here to hear Bishop Moore and face the challenge of our opportunity. When the critical moment came and decisions had to be made many asked that their membership be transferred to the "Northside" Church.

Dickey, Treasurer. H. S. McCurry was chosen Chairman of Ushers.



The four ministers—the Rev. W. L. Selman, Northside Bap-




